EXTERNAL FACING COURSE UNIT OVERVIEW

The unit provides an overview of the place and function of the ministry of the Word in the major Christian churches. It introduces students to critical discussions of the relationship between preaching and pastoral leadership and examines the difference between 'preaching' and 'teaching' and its implications for planning regular worship, including 'all-age' worship. It discusses the use of a lectionary as a pattern for regular public reading of Scripture and specific issues which arise when using the lectionary, both on particular occasions and over a period of time. It explores the dynamics of preaching sermon series, whether based on the lectionary or not.

COURSE UNIT OVERVIEW

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AIMS

To help students develop the knowledge, skills and confidence to plan and manage an ongoing ministry of the Word in the context of their church's regular worship.
